Preamble The roles of President and Secretary Treasurer may require relocation and may affect family life; and a longer term would facilitate planning for those taking on the roles of President and Secretary Treasurer; and a longer term would more realistically reflect the length of time served in Vice-President positions.

[180] To amend parts of FPSE Constitution § 7 Presidents' Council (to take effect in 2020) as follows: 7.2 The President shall be elected for a one year two year term at the AGM... 7.3 The Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected separately for a one year two year term at the AGM... 7.4 A First Vice President shall be elected for a one year two year term at the AGM... 7.5 A Second Vice President shall be elected for a one year two year term at the AGM.... Term Length for Executive Positions

Preamble Succession planning is important to the overall health of the organization and having a known end of term date would facilitate this planning.

[181] To amend parts of FPSE Constitution § 7 Presidents' Council (to take effect in 2020) as follows: 7.2incoming and outgoing Presidents. A President may stand for consecutive re-election so long as their total time as President is no more than six consecutive years. 7.3following the AGM. A Secretary-Treasurer may stand for consecutive re-election so long as their total time as Secretary-Treasurer is no more than six consecutive years.

13. REVENUE

- 13.1 Revenue, investments and other property of the Federation may be held in the name of the FPSE Holding Society.
- 13.2 The revenue of the Federation shall be derived **primarily** from monthly dues and levies charged to members of the Federation at rates to be determined by the Annual General Meeting, or a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.
- 13.3 Notwithstanding Article 13.2 or any other provision in this Constitution, the Presidents' Council may, by resolution, waive payment of dues by a member organization pending certification or negotiation of a first collective agreement.
- 13.4 Each member organization shall forward to the Federation, at least monthly, a statement showing the gross total salaries of persons currently paying dues to the member organization and the member organization shall remit the per capita amount payable from such dues, in accordance with this Constitution.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FEDERATION OF POST-SECONDARY EDUCATORS OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

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13. REVENUE

- 13.1 Revenue, investments and other property of the Federation may be held in the name of the FPSE Holding Society.
- 13.2 The revenue of the Federation shall be derived in part from monthly dues and levies charged to members of the Federation at rates to be determined by the Annual General Meeting, or a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.
- 13.3 Notwithstanding Article 13.2 or any other provision in this Constitution, the Presidents' Council may, by resolution, waive payment of dues by a member organization pending certification or negotiation of a first collective agreement.
- 13.4 Each member organization shall forward to the Federation, at least monthly, a statement showing the gross total salaries of persons currently paying dues to the member organization and the member organization shall remit the per capita amount payable from such dues, in accordance with this Constitution.
- 13.5 The Federation shall establish and maintain a Defence
 Fund to support members engaged in strike, lockout, or
 picket line recognition or for such other action in
 defence of the Federation as is approved by the
 Presidents' Council. Member organizations shall not be
 eligible to receive financial payments from the Fund until
 at least six (6) months after joining the Fund. Member
 organizations that receive support payments from the
 Fund shall continue to participate and pay into the Fund
 for at least two (2) years beyond the date of last
 receiving support payments.
- 13.6 The Federation shall develop a set of procedures to allow it to make support payments to member organizations participating in the Defence Fund and engaged in strike, lockout, or picket line recognition, providing that the member organization meets the conditions established and promulgated in advance by the Presidents' Council.
- 13.7 The fiscal year of the Federation shall end on March 31st of each year.

13.5 The fiscal year of the Federation shall end on March 31st of each year.

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- 14.1 The Federation shall establish and maintain an Action Fund to support any approved action or initiative that falls within the purposes of the federation as set out in the Constitution and to support member organizations engaged in strike, lockout, or picket line recognition or for such other action as approved by the Presidents' Council.
- 14.2 The Federation shall develop procedures to allow it to support actions consistent with the purposes set out in 14.1 and which meet any conditions established and promulgated in advance by the Presidents' Council.
- 14.3 Member organizations shall be eligible to receive financial payments from the Fund normally only after being a member of the Federation for at least six (6) months.
- 14.4 Member organizations that receive support payments from the Action Fund shall continue to remain member organizations of the Federation for at least two (2) years beyond the date of last receiving support payments.
